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Text (from the 'Song of Solomon' 8:6–7):

Set me as a seal upon thy heart, Set me as a seal upon thine arm.

For love is strong as death. Many waters cannot quench love, neither can the floods drown it.

A note on the piece:

The 'Set me as a seal upon thy heart' text paints a vivid portrait of immutable consistency. I have taken up that theme in this setting, symbolically using a single pitch as a centre to which the music continually returns. In the outer sections, this pitch stands as a consistent line around which symmetrically balanced melodies and chords weave.

A central section accelerates through a cascade of 'many waters' depicted by descending scalic patterns. The scales pull down, but the pitch collections give the impression of rising. This creates a more oblique kind of symmetry that reaches its culmination at the words 'drown it.'

I wrote this piece to sing at my brother's wedding. The setting is dedicated with love to Matthew and Victoria.
