J. S. SVENDSEN. Op: 9

Born in Christiania in 1840, Johan Svendsen is best known to fame chiefly through his popular compositions for the Violin.

His muse can scarcely be regarded as truly Scandinavian in the sense manifested in the work of Gade and Grieg, but whatever he wrote is invariably fresh and tuneful. It is not a little surprising that with his northern temperament Svendsen should have succeeded so admirably in depicting such an essentially southern scene as a Carnival, and yet despite the notable illustrations of the subject by Berlioz and Dvorak, the present instance is a vivid and faithful reproduction of the Festival according to Parisian ideas.

Without further preparation than a crescendo note of four bars length, the plunge is taken into the midst of the most vivacious and exciting surroundings. As the music proceeds the listener may easily picture the incidents with which these occasions teemranging from the comic to the pathetic, and from high spirited revelry to irresistible drollery.
