## IN GEORGIA FOUR SOUTHERN SKETCHES


Lyric Suite for Piano

In these engaging miniatures one discovers indeed a true Tone Picture of the South. Through the works of Stephen Foster, Sidney Lanier, and Joel Chandler Harris, and now Mortimer Wilson, there is reflected the spirit of the Southern darkey. In nearly all of the so-called Southern plantation songs, the theme of the darkey has been - not himself, but his master or the master's family. This indigenous type of song is then a reflective view of the white man, and as well, of the climate, the lakes, rivers and hills.

Although the themes of these four pieces are original, they nevertheless are a faithful delineation of America's folksong antebellum heritage, the universally familiar Southern melody style pervading every measure.

That they are also from the pen of one of America's most scholarly composers, further adds to their interest.

A medium degree of difficulty places them within the reach of pianists of moderate attainments and makes them ideally suited for teaching use, as well as for recital or recreational purposes.
